This catalogue contains references to almost 2000 websites. These in turn refer to a total of more than 30 000 other websites. Researchers will find references to various types of source material, research and resources in numerous foreign countries, as well as a wide range of research institutes and archival preserves.

Die moeilikste deel van genealogiese navorsing is sekerlik om te weet waar om te begin. Die web het nie alleen verwysings na internetbronne nie, maar daar is ook ander hulpmiddelle beskikbaar, soos hedendaagse betaaldienste, poslyste, sosiale media, biblioteekkatalogi en vele ander. Die doel van hierdie Katalogus vir die WWW-Genealoog is dan juis om 'n bietjie struktuur en rigting aan die genealogiese navorsing te gee wanneer dit kom by die soek na relevante bronne.

Die katalogus bevat verwysings na bykans 2 000 webwerwe. Altesaam verwys dit sekerlik weer na meer as 30 000 ander webwerwe. Ten einde hierdie magdom inligting sinvol aan te bied, is die boek ingedeel in 18 hoofstukke, wat elke moontlike genealogiese tema dek. Navorsers kan verwysings vind na verskeie soorte bronmateriaal, navorsing en hulpmiddelle in verskeie oorsese lande en 'n wye verskeidenheid van navorsingsinstansies en argivale bewaarplekke.

Dit is 'n nuttige en onontbeerlike handleiding vir enige beginner of gesoute en ervare genealoog.
